Articles are listed by title, with issue number followed by a forward slash (/) and page numbers.

It is intended that the index will be updated annually; available free as a PDF on the Society website (www.ohiopostalhistory.com) or by request to ohiopostalhistory@gmail.com.

Attempts have been made for consistency and accuracy, but it is inevitable that discretionary calls are made and that mistakes occur. This index was not prepared by a degreed professional, but rather by postal historians. Your feedback on the use of this index is welcomed. Please note that the author index attempts to list all articles appearing under bylines. The City and Town index captures articles that are about or specifically reference material from a particular town. The County index is reserved for articles that deal with Ohio postal history generally at the county level rather than specific towns (i.e., the county index will not identify articles about individual towns within a county). The subject index attempts to capture relevant areas of distinct interest.
